

March Meeting: <u>March is National Craft Month</u>. March is National Craft Month. We will display your "Craft Other than Quilts" at our "Craft Share" meeting in March. All members are encouraged to bring their crafting production to our general meeting. We will entertain one another with the results of our activities when we're not quilting. Photography, basket weaving, doll making, rug hooking, crochet, knitting...the list is endless and we all marvel at the skills our members possess. You won't 'teach' your craft that day, just share with us. Later you may get

requests from individual members about your crafting interests and maybe make new friends. **March Workshop**: Kay Crane is planning a Quilted Name Badge half-day workshop after our March 4 meeting. We will continue signing up at the March meeting. The cost will be \$15 at sign-up. If you signed up at our February meeting and didn't receive a copy of the supply list, email Kay or me and we'll get one to you. We're in the directory on our website. Bring a lunch, your supplies, and machine.



April Workshop: We will have her "One Block Inspired Modern Quilt" half-day Design Workshop following the regular meeting. Sign-ups will continue in March. Be sure that you get the supply list from the sign-up table. No machine or fabric required...just supplies to make a paper version of the original block you create using the 24"x24" printed template Nancy will provide each of you. The cost will be \$20 workshop fee + \$5 supply fee (Total \$25). Bring a lunch.

April Workshop Wednesday April 2nd: Theresa Jackson will present Mary Kay Mouton's newest technique of "Flip and Quilt" in a full-day workshop the Wednesday after our April meeting. 
Shirt sales were a success! The Guild members purchased 49 shirts resulting in \$357 to the Guild. We will have them in hand for distribution at the March 4th meeting.

LOQG Block of the Month Challenge 2024 - 2025 - Kay Dejno

This month, I am giving you 2 patterns, one for March and a Bonus which is August. That way, by the end of challenge you will have all 12 blocks for the year. You do not have to have all of them in your final quilt top, but you may use any of these blocks. Your final top MUST have a minimum of 9 blocks but you can have more. I hope you are enjoying making the block each month and am looking forward to seeing all of them in June.

Member Spotlight – Karen Whitt



I have long tried many different creative avenues including garment pattern drafting and fabrication. I have not been all that successful! The organization and precise nature of quilting has long been attractive to me. When I moved to Madison in 2019 I happened to meet Kathy Thompson who talked about quilting (among the other things we both like to do) and I was hooked. I took a class at Sew Sew Studio and have continued to experiment with varying degrees of success.

The first quilt I competed before this became an addiction was simple squares with flowers made of a gathered circle and covered button at the intersections. That was 15 years ago. In this period of my quilting life my first project was the Wunderbar quilt in 2020.

I use an Elnita ef72 (the European version of a Janome). UFO's are unexpectedly increasing in my creative room. I have three baby quilts waiting quilting and binding. Then I have improvisation squares for lap quilts that are piling up!!! I think they will become two quilts. My favorite fabric to work is anything joyful! I love an explosion of color! I have a small stash of fabric (it has to share space with my stash of yarn and paints!!!)

My favorite notion is my ¼" foot!!! My most used may be my seam ripper. When in the throes of an active project I spend 30 to 40 hours a week sewing. My favorite part is the new beginning. Cutting the fabric and getting it all organized for assembly. My least favorite part is ripping it out when it does not line up properly.

The best deals on fabrics and notions would be at the LOQG Market Table!!!

I don't have any tips – yet – I am still so new.

TIps of the Trade

- After designing and fusing several applique blocks, I stitch around all the pieces that require the same color of thread. Then, I stitch the next group of pieces with another thread color.
- For an easy, inexpensive, portable light table, place an under-the-counter fluorescent light strip under an inverted clear plastic storage bin.
- A weekly pill box is perfect to hold bobbins and other small items to take to workshops.
- Place several spools of thread for hand sewing in a large salt shaker with a snap-off top. Run each thread tail through a hole in the top so it is ready to use.






