Workshop: Quilting Row by Row: 27 Skill Building Techniques

Our row this month will be the paper pieced birds. If you have never done paper piecing before it might be helpful to watch some YouTube videos or try a free online pattern.

Please bring a personal sized cutting mat, rotary cutter and small irons if you have them.

Because of our brunch, the library will be closed in December, so check out books in November that you can keep til January.


#### Hospitality - Kay Crane, Kathy Sands and Mary Anne Shelton

#### **Tips of the Trade**

- Use a small address label or mark your initials with a permanent marker to identify your pressure feet, bobbins, scissors, etc. before taking them to classes or workshops.
- For a fast alternative to hand-finished binding, attach the binding to the back of the quilt. Bring the folded edge to the front. Machine stitch the binding in place with a decorative stitch.
- To join strips of various types of fabric, such as cotton, wool, and silk, place the fabric with the most stretch on the bottom, against the machine feed dogs, to control stretch.

# Quilts for Doggies and Kitties

We are asking all Quilt Guild Members to make a quilt for the Lake Oconee Humane Society and bring it to the November and/or December meeting. We would like to deliver them to the Shelter in time for the Holiday Adoption Season.

From the samples we made, the instructions are pretty simple. Sew together two fat quarters with batting (Cotton or 80/20 is best).

Sew your fabric right sides together with batting on top. Leave a small opening to turn them right side out and quilt any way you like. Machine quilt, free motion, longarm, use decorative stitches making squares, stripes or diamonds, or stencil a pattern you like.

Use your scrap fabric, sample quilt squares you put together, or just a fat quarter.

We will take pictures of all the quilts when they are turned in and submit them to our Publicity Chair for publication before taking them to the Shelter.


