I have been fascinated by yarn and fabric since I was 6 years old. As I was growing up, I tried every kind of needlework I could get my hands on. It was natural that I ended up in the textile department in college. For decades, I wove room sized rugs for Lyn Sterling Montagne, who made custom rugs for interior designers. During this time I wove scarves, blankets and tableware on my own time. 25 years ago I took up quilting, and immediately fell Color in love. I have since realized how much being a weaver for decades has had an effect on my quilting. Both weaving and quilting rely on color interplay and repeated geometric design has always been one of my favorite things, and years of hand dying yarn has given me an extensive foundation in working with color.



Member Spotlight – Cookie Noel



I started quilting during the bicentennial because I belonged to a needlework guild that wanted to do something for the Governor of Missouri to commemorate the event. (I lived in St. Louis at the time.) None of us were quilters, but we dug in and created the quilt. Most of it was applique so it was a steep learning curve. That lit the fire that led to more quilts and more quilts! My first quilts were all hand done because I had a machine phobia. I joined Thimble and Thread Quilt Guild and participated in the challenge of doing two blocks a month to keep. I got over my fear and have machine pieced ever since.

I married my childhood pen pal and he worked in Illinois teaching at a small rural college. When the weather was bad, he did not get home some weekends so to entertain myself I worked on finishing quilts, which later became Valentines him. We were married 50 years when he passed away in 2019. We had two daughters both who are married and live out of state. I have one grandchild who is 10 and lives with his parents in Illinois. The other daughter is married and lives in Vermont. She was a veterinarian and fed my other addiction (the first one is fabric) which is dogs, of which I currently have two. Both are spoiled rotten and one who likes to preview the fabric scraps for my quilts!
