









October

Member Spotlight - Theresa Jackson



My mother took up quilting in her 70s and was making quilts for all of her grandchildren as they married. When she passed away, I still had four unmarried children, so I took up quilting so that they wouldn't be left out.

Most of my sewing is done with a Bernina Artista 165 that was my mom's. Unfortunately, the screen is going out on it and I may have to upgrade before too much longer. I have an artistic Quilter SD 16 that I use for free motion quilting.

The first quilt that I completed was a blooming nine patch. Carol McRae quilted it for me. It hangs from my loft banister so I can see it every day.

I would have to do some digging to tell you how many UFOs I currently have. Let's just say I'm better at starting than I am at finishing.

My favorite fabric to work with is free fabric. I have been given quite a bit of fabric that I must use up before I buy anything else. I do have stash, and lots of it that is mostly scraps.

My favorite notions are my walking foot and the little rubber things that keep your bobbin and matching thread together.

Unfortunately, my sewing time is kind of hit or miss when I'm really involved in a project. I may sew several hours for several days in a row and then I may not sew again for a month. My favorite part of quilting is piecing, and my least favorite is sewing on the binding.

I find the best deals on fabrics and notions at estate sales.

I have noticed when I'm making a quilt that requires several blocks, the block gets better as I go along, therefore, making a sample block before I start the squares for my quilt is helpful.

Tlps of the Trade

- The end of Sulky thread spools snap open and closed to allow you to catch the loose end of the thread for storage.
- Dish and pan scrubbers made from nylon netting work well to remove threads from a rotary cutting mat.
- You can place your sewing machine on a terry cloth towel to reduce vibration and movement.


